
CENTENARY CELEBRATION

This year marks the 100th anniversary of Y's Men International! 100 years of service! The year we celebrate, tell the world about our activities, and spread awareness of our movement for international fellowship and service.

For a little short on our club's history, it was founded in Toledo, Ohio, USA, in 1922 to support a local YMCA, founded by Judge Paul William Alexander together with a group of other young men. The largest non-governmental youth organization in the world, the YMCA, and the communities it is present in all around the world are the focus of Y's Men International right now. It was named "Y's Men's Club" since the YMCA is commonly referred to as "the Y" in the USA and because the Y's Men movement began there as a club of "men of and for the Y."

Now for the present, the 100th anniversary calls for a celebration. The occasion celebrated during May was a call on the spirit of the youth and

incited encouragement for passing this huge milestone. Since it is the 100th anniversary, it is only fitting up with to come suggestions to celebrate the occasion benefitting society. 1906 SAW THE RAISING OF THE INDIAN FLAG

On August 7, 1906, in Kolkata's Parsee Bagan Square, the three red, yellow, and green horizontal stripes of the national flag of India were raised. Pingali Venkayya created the original version of our current national flag in 1921. The 24-spoke Ashok Chakra and saffron, white, and green stripes of the current flag were officially adopted on July 22, 1947, and flown for the first time on August 15, 1947.

5 MORE COUNTRIES CELEBRATE INDEPENDENCE DAY ON AUGUST 15TH

In addition to India, five other nations also observe Independence Day on August 15 including Bahrain, Liechtenstein, the Republic of Congo, North Korea, and South Korea.

GOA WAS THE FINAL STATE TO JOIN THE INDIAN TERRITORY IN 1961

Goa was still a Portuguese colony on August 15, 1947, the day India gained freedom. It was only in 1961 when Indian soldiers annexed it. Goa was the final state to join the Indian subcontinent.

ONLY ONE LOCATION IN INDIA PRODUCES THE INDIAN FLAG

The Indian flag is authorized to be produced and supplied by the Karnataka Khadi Gramodyoga Samyukta Sangha (KKGSS), a group based in Dharwad, Karnataka. The Bureau of Indian Standards states that only hand-spun and hand-woven cotton khadi bunting is used to create the national flag






